1. Qualitative Information on Consolidated Financial Results for the Period under Review

(1) Qualitative Information on Consolidated Results of Operations

Notwithstanding the trend toward a recovery from the chaos resulting from the Great East Japan Earthquake, uncertainties about the future of the Japanese economy remained during the six months ended August 31, 2011, given such factors as the prolonged power shortage, slowdown of the U.S. and European economies, and the yen appreciation.

Operational environment surrounding the Company showed signs of a gradual recovery in spite of concerns about a drop in consumer confidence due to the effects of the earthquake while functional material products with power-saving features and "Cool Biz" products posted strong sales. In addition, while low price goods have been established as normal offering and clearance sales are starting earlier, original products which feature in the forefront added values, such as designs and materials, also performed well. Moreover, there was a tendency of focusing not only on the "price," but also on the "value."

However, profitability continues to be squeezed due to soaring production costs in China and the continued shortage of labor at sewing factories in the coastal regions.

In such an environment, the Group endeavored to draw up product plans with added value while developing new customers through specialty stores and mail order for clothing. With regard to product items, one-piece dresses, bottoms, swimsuits, rain goods, etc. posted strong sales, and autumn wear, such as blouses and knitwear, also showed steady sales compared with last year which had a record-breaking late summer heat.

As a result, consolidated performance in the six months ended August 31, 2011 registered 31,717 million yen net sales (4.3% increase from the previous corresponding period), which was the first increase in four periods, 342 million yen operating income (219 million yen operating loss in the previous corresponding period), and 388 million yen ordinary income (67.1% increase from the previous corresponding period). Net loss was 332 million yen (146 million yen net income in the previous corresponding period), due to posting of 820 million yen in extraordinary loss, including 545 million yen loss on valuation of investment securities.

(2) Qualitative Information on Consolidated Financial Position

1) Assets

Current assets decreased 1,378 million yen compared with the end of the previous fiscal year, to 21,474 million yen, due primarily to 2,405 million yen decrease in notes and accounts receivable – trade, despite 730 million yen increase in cash and deposits and 241 million yen increase in deferred tax assets (current).

Noncurrent assets increased 401 million yen compared with the end of the previous fiscal year, to 23,381 million yen, due primarily to 936 million yen increase in land and 130 million yen increase in deferred tax assets (noncurrent), despite 674 million yen decrease in investment securities.

As a result, total assets decreased 977 million yen compared with the end of the previous fiscal year, to 44,855 million yen.

2) Liabilities

Liabilities decreased 20 million yen compared with the end of the previous fiscal year, to 18,251 million yen, due primarily to 604 million yen increase in derivative liabilities surpassed by the combined effect of 530 million yen decrease in loans payable and 93 million yen decrease in deferred tax liabilities (noncurrent).

3) Net assets

Net assets decreased 956 million yen compared with the end of the previous fiscal year, to 26,604 million yen, due primarily to a decrease in retained earnings and deferred gains or loss on hedges.

(3) Qualitative Information on Consolidated Financial Results Forecast

Financial results forecast has not changed since its earlier announcement on April 11, 2011.

(2) Adoption of Simplified Accounting Methods and Special Accounting Treatment

1) Simplified Accounting Methods

(i) Valuation of inventories

The carrying amount of inventories is only reduced to estimated net selling value when there is an obvious decrease of profitability.

(ii) Method of calculating depreciation of noncurrent assets

For the assets subject to the declining-balance method, depreciation is calculated pro rata based on the annual depreciation during the fiscal year.

(iii) Method of calculating deferred and accrued account items

Some of the deferred and accrued account items are posted as estimate based on reasonable calculation methods.

(iv) Method of calculating income taxes, deferred tax assets, and deferred tax liabilities

In calculating income taxes, only important items are subject to adjustment by addition or subtraction or tax-deduction.

Collectability of deferred tax assets is determined by referring to the business forecast and tax planning as applied in the previous fiscal year, provided that there has been no significant change since the end of the previous fiscal year, either in the operational environment or in the accrual status of temporary difference.

Income taxes for the less important consolidated subsidiaries that have experienced no significant changes in their operational environments are calculated by multiplying incomes before income taxes with the rates of corporate tax burden after the application of deferred tax accounting on the basis of the previous fiscal year's statements of income.

2) Special Accounting Treatment for the Consolidated Financial Statements

(3) Changes in Accounting Principles, Procedures or Format

Adoption of "Accounting Standard for Asset Retirement Obligations," etc.

The Company adopted "Accounting Standard for Asset Retirement Obligations" (ASBJ Statement No. 18, March 31, 2008) and "Guidance on Accounting Standard for Asset Retirement Obligations" (ASBJ Guidance No.

As a result, operating income decreased 2 million yen, ordinary income decreased 2 million yen, and loss before income taxes and minority interests increased 61 million yen during the six months ended August 31, 2011. In addition, there was a change in asset retirement obligations of 107 million yen due to the implementation of this accounting standard, etc.
